TASK LIST

Find A Safe Place To Stay

- Research pet-friendly lodging in several directions, note cancellation policies, and make needed reservations.
- Consider staying with friends and family
- Know your hurricane evacuation routes.

Ask An Out-Of-State Friend Or Relative To Be An Emergency Contact For Family And Pets

Have All Pet Vaccines Up To Date

Create A Pet Information Sheet And Put In A Water-Proof Zip-Lock Bag

- Veterinarian name, address, + phone number
- Health records for each animal
- Medical/behavior issues
- Feeding/medication schedule
- Microchip numbers for each animal
- Take a photo of your family and your pet together for proof of ownership and another of just your pet

Make A Flyer For Each Of Your Pets

- Put your pet's name at the top of the flyer, add both photos, in-state and out-of-state contact information, unusual markings or colorings on the animal.
- Make 10 copies of each flyer.

Have A Large Carrier For Each Pet

- They should have enough room to stand up and move around as well as room for food and water bowls and a shoebox size litter box, if needed.
- Mark your name, address, phone numbers, and emergency out-of-state contact information with a permanent marker.
- Put a laminated label on the carrier with any medications (including dose and frequency) with veterinarian and pharmacy phone numbers.
- Line each carrier with a puppy training pad in case of accidents or spills.

Put Identification On Each Pet

- Microchip and register each of your pets.
- Collar or harness with rabies number, pet name, your name, address, and phone numbers.
- Add additional tag with emergency out-ofstate contact information.
- Have a spare writable collar or tag for temporary addresses.

Some families choose to prepare to evacuate in the event of major storms while others choose to shelter-in-place. Even if you plan to evacuate only for a few hours, bring your pets with you.

Be prepared to move before disaster strikes. Keep pets safely secured in a pet carrier with their collar on when traveling for maximal safety.

SUPPLY LIST

- Manual can opener
- Food and water bowls plus one extra
- Spoons and/or scoops
- 2-week supply of water per pet

Water Per Day

- A 10 lb. animal drinks 1 pint (16 oz.)
- A 20 lb. animal drinks 1 quart (32 oz.)
- A 50 lb. animal drinks 1/2 gallon (64 oz.)
- 2-week supply of medications
- Pet first aid kit www.petfirstaidkits.com
- 2-week supply of cat litter, scoop + litter pan
- Plastic trash bags to handle waste
- Cleaning and misc. supplies
 - Paper towels
 - Liquid soap
 - Clorox wipes
 - Grooming items
 - Toys and special comfort items
 - Muzzle, if necessary
 - Writeable collars
 - Permanent Marker
 - Puppy training pads
 - Flashlight
 - Newspapers
 - Bag clips, can covers
